Mandate

SchoolNet's original mandate was to work in partnership with the provincial and territorial governments, the educational community and the private sector to connect Canadian schools and libraries to the Internet by March 31, 1999. On March 30, 1999, Canada became the first country in the world to connect its public schools, including First Nations schools, and public libraries to the Information Highway.

In its second phase, as stated in the Government of Canada's 1998 Speech from the Throne, SchoolNet's mandate was to continue working with its partners to extend connectivity into the classrooms.

Through the help of SchoolNet and its partners, Canadian classrooms are connected to the Internet. As of May 2000, there were close to half a million connected computers in Canadian schools.

In the 2001 Speech from the Throne, the federal government committed to provide increased access to high-speed Internet service for schools and libraries, and to focus on creating more and better e-learning content. To date, the SchoolNet web site links to more than 5,000 teacher approved learning resources, making it easier for Canadian teachers and students to access an immense source of online resources.

Mission

SchoolNet readies learners for the knowledge-based society. It champions lifelong learning and the creation of world-class educational resources through information and communication technology (ICT) and partnerships.
