³ This new program would provide grants to minority-serving institutions to enable students to earn dual degrees, one at their home institution and the second at another institution, such as a major research university, in a field in which the student's racial or ethnic group is underrepresented.

⁴ This proposed program would support retention efforts by colleges aimed at students who are at a high risk of dropping out.

⁵ Two existing federal programs that support teacher training would be folded into a new proposed program, Teaching to High Standards State Grants.

⁶ President Clinton's fiscal-2001 budget provides \$2.111-billion for AIDS research, and would have the Office of AIDS Research distribute the funds. In its appropriations for fiscal 1999 and fiscal 2000, Congress provided no money directly to the AIDS office. The figure shown for the Office of AIDS Research is not included in the total; rather, the funds for AIDS research are included in the proposed budgets for many of the institutes.

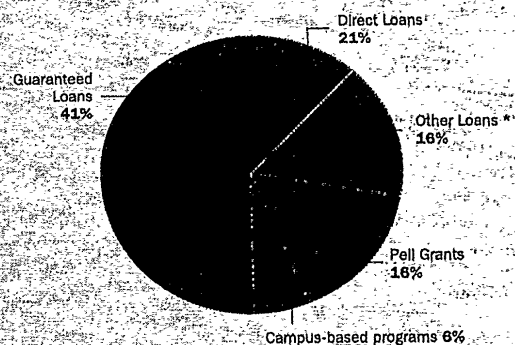

Note: President Clinton's budget seeks \$11.7-billion in direct appropriations for student aid and loans, which would result in \$54.2-billion in student financial assistance over all, including nearly \$43-billion in loan capital.

\$85-billion for research and development, by agency

Spending would rise 3 percent over all, with increases chiefly for the National Institutes of Health (within the Department of Health and Human Services) and the National Science Foundation.
